RE: GRANTING CITIZENSHIP TO 700,000 PLUS DACA LATINOS

Dear House Member:

That I should have to write such a letter to Senators and House Members of the United States Congress is shameful. Fortunately, due to the courageous decisions by Judge Nicholas Garaufis in Brooklyn and Judge William Alsup in San Francisco, our ship of state has made a temporary moral course correction. Quoting Judge Garaufis: Citing Trump's "*recurring redundant drumbeat of anti-Latino commentary...*" in summary "*This isn't ordinary..*" continuing, "*In this country, in over 250 years, it's extreme, it's recurrent and it's vicious.*"¹

Added to the collective failures of House, Senate and Executive, the lingering threats directed at these Latinos have imposed a cruel, unusual and completely undeserved punishment reminiscent of the horrible experience of Anne Frank.
